	Premium capitation income exceeded \$1 billion for the year	
	which was due to increase in enrollment, increase in	
	capitation rates, and increase in the ACA PCP rate increase	
	payments. Capitation medical costs expense, administrative	
	service agreement fees expense, and taxes will all be higher	
	than budgeted amounts. All other expense items were	
	below budgeted amounts with the exception of insurance.	
	This was due to premium rates being higher than initially	
	projected. Net income was approximately \$13.3 million,	
	which included \$3 million of the Health Net loan that was	
	forgiven.	
	Overall CVH was ahead of budgeted income by
